<u>Gardner Bullis School</u> Consequences



Our goal is to encourage nurturing, positive behavior from our students by using positive consequences such as: classroom rewards, Caught with Character recognition, Grizzly Greatness awards, visits with Mrs. Gilbert, a complementary call home and feeling good inside.

There are times, however, when negative consequences are required to modify unacceptable behavior as well as ensure that all students see that negative behavior is addressed immediately and appropriately whenever possible, confirming for them the safety of our school.

Playground rules

Students are expected to:

- Play in their designated grade level areas.
- Eat snacks at tables and clean up after themselves.
- Keep games open to everyone.
- Refrain from spitting, pushing and play fighting.
- Line up immediately when the bell rings. Recess is over.

Bathroom conduct

Students are expected to:

- Enter, use, flush, wash and leave.
- Help conserve water, paper, and soap.
- Help keep bathrooms clean and safe.

Lunchtime conduct

Students are expected to:

- Walk with their teacher to tables/servery.
- Eat their lunch and clean up after themselves.
- Refrain from playing at the tables while others are eating.
- Wait at their tables until excused to the playground.
- Refrain from having food on the playground.

<u>Gardner Bullis School</u> Dress code



The purpose of a dress code is to help students set a standard for their personal appearance. A student's dress often will determine conduct and academic attitude. Clothing must be clean and appropriate for the season, without holes.

<u>Clothing</u>

Some clothing that is appropriate for wear away from school may not be appropriate for wear at school. Any clothing or apparel that is distracting or a disturbance to the educational process will not be permitted, such as:

- Clothing which has slogans that are in poor taste, such as advertising for alcoholic beverages, inappropriate language, etc.
- Clothing that does not cover the midriff, cleavage or does not conceal underwear.
- Hats and sunglasses are permitted outdoors only.

<u>Shoes</u>

Students should be dressed appropriately to participate in Physical Education and recess activities everyday. Shoes like Crocs and thongs are not appropriate for school activities. Students should be able to run, jump, and be able to kick a firm ball. Shoes with wheel are not allowed at school. Sneakers and tennis shoes are the best choices.
